

1. Managers & Coaches

- Teams may have up to 3 eligible coaches regardless of roster size
- All managers & coaches must complete the Diamond Leader Training to be eligible
- 2. Rule 1.11 Arm Bands / Play-Calling Bands
 - To be worn only on wrist or forearm, not attached to belt or other part of body
 - Must be solid in color and not white, gray, (baseball) or optic yellow (softball)
 - Umpire may have it removed if considered distracting to the batter
- 3. Rule 6.08 Intentional Walk
 - All Divisions can announce such decision to plate umpire prior to or during the at-bat
 - Pitch count is incremented with necessary remaining pitches to walk
 - A player may only be intentionally walked by announcing such decision once during the gam



- 4. Mandatory Play Continuous Batting Order (CBO)
 - The previous tournament mandatory play rule has been replaced with a Continuous Batting Order (CBO) requirement for all divisions of tournament play except for the Senior Division
 - CBO includes all players on the team affidavit present at the start of the game to appear in the batting order.
 - Each player is required to bat in his/her respective spot in the batting order
 - There is no longer a defensive requirement to mandatory play with the move to the continuous batting order



- 4. Mandatory Play Continuous Batting Order (CBO)
 - If a player is injured, becomes ill, or must leave the game site after the start of the game, the team will <u>skip over without penalty</u> the player at time of bat
 - If the injured, ill, or absent player returns, player is merely re-inserted into their original batting spot and the game continues
 - If a player arrives late to a game site and the manager chooses to enter player in the lineup, player would be <u>added to the end of the current lineup</u>
 - If a player is unable to complete a plate appearance due to injury, illness, or ejection, the <u>next batter in the lineup shall take player's place and assume</u> <u>the count</u> of the original batter



4. Mandatory Play – Courtesy Runner

- 8-10, 9-11, 10-12, Intermediate, & Junior League -> Courtesy Runner
- Senior -> Special Pinch Runner (SPR)
- Utilizing continuous batting order, the Courtesy Runner must be in the team's batting order and be the player who made the last out
- Courtesy Runner can be used for:
 - either the catcher and/or pitcher of record when there are two (2) outs
 - a player is unable to run the bases due to injury, illness, or ejection



4. Mandatory Play – Penalties

- Managers are solely responsible for ensuring that all players fulfill the requirements of playing participation
- The Tournament Committee reserves the right to impose penalties, which may be imposed, if, in the opinion of the Tournament Committee:
 - A manager/coach takes any action that results in making a travesty of the game
 - A team fails to meet the requirements of this rule more than once during the International Tournament
 - A manager willfully and knowingly disregards this rule



5. "But I've done it this way all season."

- Run Rule
 - Removes the condition for all divisions of play requiring the manager of the team behind by 8 or more runs after 5 innings to concede victory
 - 15 and 10 run rules still apply
- Warming Up Pitcher
 - Managers or coaches <u>are not</u> permitted to warm up a pitcher at home plate or in the bullpen or elsewhere at any time including in-game warm-up, pre-game warm-up, and in other instances



Bats (non-wood)

- Must pass through ring
- Must be in good condition (e.g. no cracks, flat spots, dents)
- No batting donuts allowed



Helmets

- All require NOCSAE and warning logo
- Batting Helmets
 - free of cracks
 - padding is in good condition and attached
 - alterations, including stickers, cheek guard, etc. require a letter of certification from manufacturer
- Catcher Masks
 - must include dangling throat protector
 - no missing screws
 - should have "other" helmet on too



<u>Uniform</u>

- General
 - Jewelry not allowed except for medical alert identification & hair restraint (e.g. beads)
 - Casts no players/coaches can be on field; must remain in dugout
 - Eye black can be worn; only LL policy is in regard to televised games
 - Arm Bands / Play-Calling Bands only on wrist or forearm
- Pitcher
 - Batting gloves ok if not white or gray (baseball) or yellow (softball)
 - Neoprene sleeves ok if entirely covered by uniform
 - Sunglasses ok if not distracting to batter (umpire judgment)



Plate Meeting

- Yes, we will still have a plate meeting
- Manager from each team is required
- Additional coaches allowed per team's decision
- No players ever
- "L E G S" (Line Ups, Equipment, Ground Rules, Sportsmanship)



Warming up Players and Pitchers

- Coaches are not allowed to warm up pitchers
- Players are only ones allowed with a glove
- Any player warming up pitcher must have catcher's mask with dangling throat protector and catcher's glove



Pace of Play

- Hurry in and off field
- Coaches should talk to players coming OFF Defense, not before going ON Defense
- Pitchers have 8 pitches or 1 min from when prior inning ends
- Have a player prepared to warm up pitcher if catcher not ready
- Player changes should be completed by the time pitcher completes warm up
- Coaches should be ready to take Offensive positions
- Batter must remain in batter's box with 1 foot (called strike, called ball that does not force batter out, a regular bunt caught by catcher,)
- Keep the ball "live" (batters asking for time at plate / runners asking for time after a routine safe sliding play)



Substitutions

- Due to simplified Mandatory Play changes, reporting substitutions will be greatly reduced
- Offense
 - CBO
 - only exceptions as discussed previously should be reported
- Defense
 - no longer a defensive requirement for Mandatory Play,
 - report <u>ALL</u> pitcher/catcher changes
 - Intermediate, Junior, Senior, Softball: if player was previously a pitcher, report player if removed from game
 - no need to report other non pitcher/catcher changes
 - report in between innings and/or at time of change



Pitching Changes

- Baseball
 - 8-10, 9-11, 10-12 BB: a pitcher once removed may not return as a pitcher
 - Intermediate, JLBB, SLBB: a pitcher remaining in the game, but moving to a different position, can return as a pitcher anytime in the remainder of the game, but only once_per game
- Softball
 - <u>8-10, 9-11, 10-12 SB</u>: a pitcher <u>remaining in the game</u>, but moving to a different position, can return as a pitcher anytime in the remainder of the game, but only once in the same inning as he/she was removed.
 - JLSB, SLSB: a pitcher remaining in the game, but moving to a different position, can return as a pitcher anytime in the remainder of the game, but only once in the same inning as he/she was removed;

a pitcher may be **withdrawn from the game**, offensively or defensively, and return as pitcher once per inning provided the return does not violate the substitution, visits per pitcher, or mandatory play rules



Tournament Reminders – In Game

Your Feedback

- Manager "voices" only
- No challenges on balls/strikes
- No long-distance discussions
- If you want to discuss a call, ask for time and go to umpire that made the call
- Be specific with your question or appeal
- An umpire is not required to solicit help from another umpire
- What can you appeal:
 - No = judgments (Ball/Strike, Fair/Foul, Catch/No Catch, Safe/Out)
 - Yes = missed bases, potential swinging strike (based on # of umpires), application of rules
 - Must occur when ball is in play and before the next play



Tournament Reminders – In Game

Code of Conduct

- Players / Coaches
 - expect a level of competitiveness and emotions
 - warnings / ejections can be given for:
 - language
 - physical contact
 - throwing equipment
 - stealing and relaying signs
 - prolonged discussions
 - coach feedback (non manager)
- Fans
 - responsibility Tournament Directors, not umpires or coaches
 - UIC can suspend play until Tournament Director resolves
